## Petition to Adopt a New Rule Marine Board of the State of Oregon

IN THE MATTER OF ESTABLISHING A NAVIGATION SAFETY ZONE AT CAPE KIWANDA

PETITION TO ADOPT A NEW RULE

   Petitioners has previously submitted a list of signatures and addresses of interested parties.
- PROPOSED NEW RULE
   Petitioner proposes that a navigation safety zone be established at Cape Kiwanda as follows:
  - (1) The safety zone would extend from the shoreline at the South side of Cape Kiwanda, in the waters of the State, Southward to the beach ramp, a distance of approximately 1100 yards.
  - (2) The safety zone area would be demarcated by a sector light or LED navigation lanterns, or other means of delineation as determined to be proper by the Marine Board after consultation with other involved government agencies.
  - (3) Operating a surfboard within the navigation zone whenever dory rigs and trailers are parked on the beach would be prima facie evidence of violation of ORS 830.365 (1).

## 4. STATUTORY AUTHORITY

- (1) ORS 830.175 (1) gives the Oregon State Marine Board power to make special regulations, considering the body or water and congestion, consistent with safety and property rights of the public.
- (2) ORS 830.365 (1) states that "No person shall ride or manipulate any water ski, surfboard, or similar device in a reckless or negligent manner so as to endanger any person or property".

Wherefore petitioner requests the State Marine Board to adopt the proposed new rule.
